This week, we celebrate and acknowledge our wonderful teachers with a lovely morning tea provided by our P&C. A huge thankyou to the ladies for their generous acknowledgement of the work teachers do in schools. The day is a wonderful opportunity to draw public attention to the important role of teachers in our local communities. Thank you also to Shane King MP for his kind donation which will help our P&C cater the morning tea for our staff.

Day for Daniel: This week we also expect a great turn out of red to support The Daniel Morcombe Foundation Day for Daniel. Day for Daniel is a National Day of Action to raise awareness of child safety, protection and harm prevention. It is about educating children and adults about keeping kids safe through child safety and protection initiatives. It aims to help empower children to 'Recognise, React and Report' if they feel something is not right. The Daniel Morcombe Foundation is committed to Keeping Kids Safe and was established as a lasting legacy to Daniel. Students should wear a red shirt this Friday and may bring along a gold coin donation which will be collected by our Student Council and donated to the Foundation to assist in their continued work.

Classes for 2023: A reminder that the process of formulating class lists for 2023 has begun. Parents have the opportunity to advise of any concerns they may have regarding their children's needs for next year via a form available at the office. Please do not email teachers or myself directly regarding requests for next year. All requests must be received via the form available from the office. This ensures that all requests are kept together and can then be considered at the time of making class placements. Teachers will consider the most appropriate placement for individual students into class groupings with the aim being to construct well balanced classes in which students can work and perform to their full potential. Due consideration is given to the student's academic needs as well as their social and emotional needs when placement is decided. Should parents wish to have input to the process you may collect a 'request for consideration' form from the office. Please note that although we cannot guarantee requests, we will consider parent suggestions and work hard to achieve the best outcomes across all class groups. Thank you to those who have already completed and handed in your forms to the office.

Should your child/ren not be returning to Jinibara SS in 2023, please inform our office as soon as possible. This assists us with planning for staffing and classes next year and also limits the amount of potential class changes required post the Day 8 count if we are given fair warning of anticipated numbers.


Like last year, we will not be posting class lists before the end of 2022. Our area is undergoing rapid change with families coming and going form the area regularly. This increases the likelihood of last minute changes to class numbers and make up. I do not believe it is fair to children to tell them that they have a particular teacher, and have them spend the 6 week Christmas break believing that to be true, if in fact there is a high possibility that it might change at the start of the year. I am hesitant to release class lists knowing they are likely to change. Please note, that my number one priority here is what is best for students. For this reason, classes will be emailed during the pupil free day week in January and parents will be able to come for a 'meet and greet' on Friday 20th January. On these days, teachers undertake planning and professional development, however we will ensure to timetable some time for them to be in their rooms on the Friday afternoon to meet parents and students if they wish to drop in and meet their teacher before the first official day of school on Monday 23rd January. This is entirely optional, however is something we'd like to offer families who wish to take it up. Exact times for the meet and greet will be confirmed later this year.

Please ensure you read all the information provided, return your SRS participation forms and pay invoices by the due date.


THE Goods & Services Scheme provides resources to parents to assist in providing items and materials which sometimes can be expensive for parents to purchase individually.

Part of the scheme provides photocopying worksheets in lieu of purchasing text / workbooks for various subject levels. These books are priced between \$14.95 and \$24.95 depending on the subject. Photocopying the C2C curriculum is a lot less expensive than purchasing these workbooks. Other funds from the scheme go towards project materials which can be difficult to purchase in either small quantities or specific items and stationery items occasionally needed in the classroom or topping up already used items.

The \$50.00 is certainly good value as it saves parents time and money compared to purchasing these items outside of the scheme.

All students have been invoiced to ensure everyone has the correct resources and items required throughout the year.

Orders placed by the due date (1st of December) will be delivered to the classrooms in the week prior to school starting.
