That is, if your letter was read some years into the future, it will let the reader understand what it was like to live in your time and place. Imagine you are writing to a penpal who lives in another country. Write 2–3 paragraphs.

a. Review the table below to assist you.

Context	Notes
historical context	Try to include a reference to some significant event of the year or recent years that will help put this letter into an historical context.
	For example, making a reference to building a house higher due to once in 100 years' flooding.
social context	By writing about various people in your life you will convey some information about the interactions of today.
	For example, reference to a grandparent living with you would convey information about the composition of families, including extended families.
cultural context	By including references to any cultural values and beliefs, you will convey information about the cultural context for you and your family and/or society.
	For example, a reference to attending the town's Anzac Day ceremony would convey the value of service to the country and recognising those who have made sacrifices for their country.

Remember the language features of a letter:

- Use one main idea in each paragraph.
- Use expressive and appropriate language and precise vocabulary.
 Establish the correct level of formality for the letter and write in that style.
- Choose language features to create mood, construct the setting and establish point of view.
- Use a range of different sentence structures and vary sentence beginnings.




