# **Policy Compliance**

The Principal will be responsible for the implementation of the Dress Code in a manner consistent with the Student Code of Conduct. Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship should contact the school office and speak with the Principal.

Consequences for non-compliance:

Consequences are reflective of the severity of the non-compliance and are inclusive of, but not limited to one of the following:

- Preventing student from attending or participating in, any activity where the student is representing the school; or
- Preventing student from attending or participating in, any activity that is not an essential school education program.
- Imposing a detention for a student during first and/or second break.

# Jinibara State School Student Dress Code



### Rationale

Jinibara State School is a uniform school and all students are expected to adhere to the Student Dress Code which is detailed in this brochure as well as in the School Handbook and the School Website. The P&C Association of Jinibara State School has collaboratively developed and endorsed this dress code. Students must wear the correct uniform combinations and must wear the uniform as it is intended to be worn. Students attending Jinibara State School are required to wear the current uniform on every school day with the exception of Principal-approved Free-Dress Days, as a condition of their enrolment at the school.

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance; instills recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community; and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are factors that have contributed to the establishment of the Jinibara State School Student Dress Code.

#### Aims:

- To readily identify students and non-students at our school.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To eliminate the distraction of competition in dress and fashion amongst students at the school.
- To foster a sense of belonging
- To develop mutual respect amongst students through minimising visible evidence of economic or social differences
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school within the community

#### Implementation:

The Jinibara State School Student Dress Code provides choice for students, allows for students to safely engage in all school activities, and caters for the financial limitations of families.

The Dress Code applies during school hours, whilst travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.

## **Uniform Description**

#### **Boys and Girls School Uniform**

- JSS logoed unisex sports shorts or skort with school polo shirt—available from the Student Supplies shop.
- School Dress (ONLY available from Student Supplies shop)
- Neutral coloured (limited bright colours and mainly black or white), enclosed shoes or joggers with laces, velcro or buckles.
- Short, ankle length plain white socks or Jinibara socks must be worn.
- Maroon or Grey tights only (available from Student Supplies shop)
- JSS logo long sleeve jacket (available from the Student Supplies shop) OR a plain maroon or grey jacket/jumper.
   No hoodies; no motifs.
- Plain maroon or grey track pants. No cargo pants.
- School reversible house coloured hat for outdoor lessons and play (ONLY available from Student Supplies shop)

#### Sports Uniform

- Students may purchase a sports shirt in their house colour and wear it when participating in sports day and the cross country. Official sports shirts may also be worn on a Friday only in order to give students an opportunity to regularly wear their house colours outside of sports events.
- Only the school reversible hat is to be worn.
- Only joggers to be worn at any school sports events (no spikes).
- District and Regional Representative shirts are not part of the school uniform and are not to be worn to school.

#### Year 6 Shirts

- These are available by through pre-order at the Student Supplies shop.
- Each shirt has current year and student's name on back.
- These shirts form part of Jinibara State School Dress Code and may be worn on any day of the week.

#### Performing Arts Polo

 These are worn by members of the choir and/or band students. Students are able to wear their polo shirts on days when they have their choir/band rehearsals only. Students are required to wear their choir/band uniform to all performances. These polos form part of the dress code and are available from the Student Supplies shop.

## **Policy Limitations**

Summer and winter uniforms, as well as sports uniforms will be prescribed, and are required to be worn. Long hair should be tied back away from the face. School coloured hair accessories are encouraged (Maroon, and/or Grey). These can be purchased from the Student Supplies shop. Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.

#### Jewellery

One set of small stud earrings or sleepers may be worn in the ears. All other piercings must be covered for health and safety reasons. Any exemptions (eg Cultural or religious reasons) will require contact with the Principal for approval. Watches, medical alerts and religious symbols tucked under the shirt are acceptable.

Students are required to wear a Sunsmart maroon hat, preferably the JSS school hat. The Student Supplies shop sells a JSS logoed reversible hat which is consistent with our Sunsmart Policy. The reversible colour is aligned with the school sporting house colours. Hats must be worn whenever a student is involved in an outdoor activity.

#### Free Dress Day Clothing

During free dress days, it is expected that students wear closed in shoes, school hats and sensible, sun-safe clothing that includes no bare stomachs and/or shoulders and no exposed areas of buttocks. ie: no mini shorts/skirts or dresses. Offensive or inappropriate text/symbols will not be permitted.
