From the Principal.....

World Teacher's Day: Every day, in classrooms around the State, Queensland teachers are making a difference educating and inspiring young Queenslanders. World Teachers' Day, on the last Friday of October, is a chance to acknowledge our teachers and say thanks. We celebrated and acknowledged our wonderful teachers with a lovely morning tea provided by our P&C. A huge thankyou to the ladies for their generous acknowledgement of the work teachers do in schools. Thank you also to Shane King MP for his kind donation which helped our P&C cater the morning tea for our staff.

Classes for 2024: A reminder that the process of formulating class lists for 2024 has begun. Parents have had the opportunity to advise of any concerns they may have regarding their children's needs for next year via a form available at the office which was due last week. Teachers will now consider the most appropriate placement for individual students into class groupings with the aim being to construct well balanced classes in which students can work and perform to their full potential. Due consideration is given to the student's academic needs as well as their social and emotional needs when placement is decided.

Should your child/ren not be returning to Jinibara SS in 2024, <u>please inform our office immediately</u>. This assists us with planning for staffing and classes next year and also limits the amount of potential class changes required post the Day 8 count if we are given fair warning of anticipated numbers.

2024 Parent Meet & Greet: Like last year, we will not be posting class lists before the end of 2023. Our area is undergoing rapid change with families coming and going from the area regularly. This increases the likelihood of last minute changes to class numbers and make up. I do not believe it is fair to children to tell them that they have a particular teacher, and have them spend the 6 week Christmas break believing that to be true, if in fact there is a high possibility that it might change at the start of the year. For this reason, classes will be emailed during the pupil free day week in January and parents will be able to come for a 'meet and greet' on Friday 19th January. On these days, teachers undertake planning and professional development, however on Friday afternoon from 1 – 2.30pm, class teachers will be in their rooms ready to meet parents

and receive book packs if you wish to bring them in prior to the first day of school. This is entirely optional, however is something we'd like to offer families who wish to take it up.

Learning goals: Students continue to work hard towards their individual writing goals. Don't forget to talk to your students about what 'star' they are working towards for their writing task. If you have any concerns or questions about your child's progress, please contact your class teacher and make a time to meet with them so that you are well informed prior to receiving your child's report card in the last week of school.

<u>Attendance levels:</u> Historically attendance levels in the last half of Term 4 decline to an all time low. This equates to students missing school each day of the final weeks of the year and means that they are missing vital assessment pieces and revision. This puts them at risk moving into the following year level.


I understand it is a busy time of year for everyone and we are all ready for a break (students, staff and parents!), but it is important that clear expectations about attendance are communicated. We are still teaching right up to the last week of school and we expect our students to be here. We look to you as parents to support us with this and we thank you in advance.

Sharing Xmas gifts and cards etc: As teachers are busy teaching and cramming in all the possible revision they can, we reserve all of our Xmas celebrations and activities until the last week of school. During week 10, teachers will have fun activities planned for students and will only then begin to wind down for the year. We ask your help in waiting until week 10 to send in cards and gifts (if that is something that you do) as it sends the wrong message to students when they begin to think the year is winding up before the teachers are ready. Class break up and party day will be held on Thursday 7th Dec and students will be welcome to come in free dress and Xmas colours. On Friday 8th Dec, any students who are present at school will be supervised in shifts and may not be with their class teacher, as on that day, equipment and furniture is cleaned, sorted and stored for cleaning to occur over the break. Students should come in full school uniform on that day and should also note there will be no tuckshop available.

Moreton Bay Suns Basketball:






